Last year the Grantham Foodbank distributed over 70 tonnes of food to 7,539 local people in crisis, of whom 2,752 were children. An increase of 53% from the previous year.

As a school we encourage punctuality and full attendance which not only impacts now, but also instils excellent life skills.

The children have been discussing ways to encourage punctuality and attendance and have decided that as well as termly certificates for full attendance children who arrive on time should be rewarded. Therefore, children will earn a house point for each day they are on time and 5 bonus house points if they arrive on time all week. A treat will be given to those who arrive on time every day for the term.
