Information

Yellow Lines

We have noticed that parents are once again parking on the yellow zigzag lines at the front of the school and even across the drive. The lines are a safety measure to protect your children and must be kept clear at the start and end of the day, so that children and other road users can see clearly when crossing the road. Please help us keep our school family safe. <u>Do not park on the yellow zigzag lines.</u>

Keeping Your Children Safe with Computer Games

With the festive season fast approaching, many of us are considering gifts for our children, including the latest computer games. It's crucial to remember that not all games are suitable for all ages, and it's important to be informed about the content and features of the games your child wants.

Games like Roblox, which is popular among children, have recently updated their parental controls to enhance safety. However, it's important to note that age ratings for Roblox vary: the platform itself suggests it's suitable for ages 7+, Google Play rates it as 10+, and the Apple App Store recommends it for ages 12+. Moreover, the platform requires parental consent for users under 18. This disparity highlights the need for parents to verify the age appropriateness of any game.

While new parental controls are a step forward, they are effective only if set up correctly with accurate age information. If a game is set up with an incorrect age, your child might still access unsuitable content. Therefore, we urge you to engage in setting up these controls and supervise your child's gaming activities closely. Ignoring age ratings and content warnings can expose children to inappropriate content and interactions with strangers. By being informed and vigilant, you can ensure that gaming is a safe and enjoyable activity for your child.

Our Christmas Party for the children will be on Thursday 19th December. Children can come to school in party / play clothes, but please make sure they have sensible shoes and a warm coat for playing outside.

We will be having a Christmas buffet lunch that day, so children will not need to bring their packed lunch, just their snack and water. We would, however, ask parents to sign up to provide party food items for everyone to enjoy at lunchtime. You will find the list on the school notice board.

We ask that all food provided is vegetarian. If your child has specific dietary requirements (dairy free, gluten free or vegan etc.) we ask that you provide something specific for them to enjoy, if they are unable to eat vegetarian food.

Food will need to be bought to school first thing on Thursday morning and put in the kitchen. If you sign up to provide a pizza or garlic bread etc, then just bring these and we will cook them at school just before lunch.

School will finish at 12:00 on the last day of term for everyone. There is no Friday Club that day.
